Pollen Allergies What You Need to Know

Your doctor may first want to confirm that you have an allergy. An allergist can give you a skin prick test to see what's causing your problem.

Once that's narrowed down, there are a few ways to treat pollen allergies:

Over-the-counter drugs:

Antihistamines Decongestants Nasal sprays

Prescription M edications:

Stronger may be prescribed if the OTC medications do not work.

Allergy Shots:

If you don't have any luck with OTC drugs and Prescription Medications Allergy Shots may help.

You'll go to the allergist every few weeks for the doctor to inject a tiny amount of what's causing your problem under your skin. After a period of months, your body should get used to the trigger and your symptoms should get better.
